#### **BUILDING ON PAST SUCCESSES!**

Nuclear Waste Partnership is building on the success of its heritage companies by giving back to the communities where we live and work. In 2014-15, NWP executed the Contractor Community Commitment Plan with fantastic results. Our employees volunteered more than 3,500 hours supporting worthwhile activities that make an impact in Eddy and Lea

counties. That's equivalent to more than 90 volunteer days! NWP and its employees also weren't shy about digging into their wallets, giving almost \$240,000 in support of worthwhile community organizations and projects. The following pages briefly describe the many ways NWP and its employees are giving back.

### REGIONAL EDUCATION OUTREACH PROGRAMS

Positive strides continue to be made with local educators to develop students' interests, skills, and experience to be candidates for careers at both WIPP and within the larger nuclear and energy industries, including:

- NWP continued its support of National Engineer's Week in February by providing hands on support to students building robots for a state robotics competition.
- NWP provided a trainer to teach the Seven
   Habits of Highly Effective Students to students
   at the Early College High School.
- The company continues to support graduating seniors in Eddy and Lea counties, providing more than \$20,000 in scholarships. NWP also supported the Excellence in Teaching Mini Grant Program with more than \$10,000 in grants.
- NWP teamed with New Mexico State
   University-Carlsbad to design and implement

the WIPP Leadership Academy, which provides instruction to first-line supervisors in areas of conflict resolution, leadership, effective communication, and more.

- A member of the NWP senior staff continues to support the Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce Education Committee, which provides a variety of educational opportunities like customer relations training for area businesses.
- NWP and its parent company, AECOM, also donated \$20,000 in support of the Partners in Education Program aimed at funding projects that bring educators, students and businesses together to work towards common goals.
- NWP partnered with Mike and Deena
   Antiporda who organized the second annual
   Inspired by Science Summer Camp, July 7-10,
   for kids who are in third through sixth grade. In addition to a \$1,500 donation, the company also provided a guest speaker for the weeklong event.

### **ECONOMIC IMPACT**

Notable initiatives implemented to enhance the positive economic impact of WIPP operations in southeast New Mexico include:

Mentor-Protégé Program - In February VI Technologies graduated as an NWP Protégé company following a highly successful 5 year program under the DOE Mentor-Protégé scheme. In their role as Mentor, NWP assisted and guided VJ Technologies in successfully competing for work for DOE prime contractors. NWP was able to apply VI Technologies' unique, specialist skills to solve a number of technical challenges for the benefit of their own DOE projects.

Local Subcontracting - NWP places a strong emphasis on small business participation. In Fiscal Year 2015, NWP procured more than \$18.7 million from businesses in Southeast New Mexico, including more than \$17.6 million in Carlsbad alone. The spending in Carlsbad represents 285 separate transactions.

Economic Development - NWP continued to support economic development efforts in Carlsbad and Eddy County. The company provided the Carlsbad Department of Development \$75,000 to support staffing needs.

#### **COMMUNITY SUPPORT**

NWP again demonstrated the company's long-standing commitment to partner with agencies to improve the quality of life for residents in local communities. Highlights include:

- Southeastern New Mexico Roadway Safety Integrated Project NWP provided key support to the Southeastern New Mexico Roadway
  Safety Integrated Project (RSIP). In its third year, this important
  initiative brings together commercial industry, federal, state, local
  governments and law enforcement agencies to mitigate potential
  traffic-related hazards to reduce vehicle injuries and fatalities in Lea
  and Eddy counties. RSIP partnered with the New Mexico Department of
  Transportation to kick off a road safety campaign earlier this year.
- SafetyFest of Southeastern New Mexico An NWP employee is cochair of the third annual SafetyFest of Southeastern New Mexico. As part of the RSIP, NWP partnered with commercial, community, law enforcement and government organizations to champion this event. The three-day safety conference emphasizes vehicle, industrial and personal safety. More than 200 people attended this year's event.
- **United Way Campaign** NWP and its employees increased their giving by almost 40%, which accounted for their best campaign ever. In addition, NWP provided resources to produce the 2014-15 campaign video, while two senior managers serve as board members.
- Day of Caring 2015 NWP partnered with the United Way of Carlsbad and South Eddy County to coordinate and plan the 2015 United Way Day of Caring. More than 350 volunteers, including more than 80 NWP employees, gathered on June 5 to help non-profit organizations with 54 service projects that were completed in a day.

**Board Service** – NWP strives to make a difference within the community where our employees live and work with service to the following community boards: Carlsbad Chamber of Commerce, Carlsbad Department of Development, Boys and Girls Club of Carlsbad, Carlsbad Medical Center, Renaissance Program, Carlsbad Community Anti-Drug/Gang Coalition, Carlsbad Rotary Club, and the United Way of Carlsbad and South Eddy County.
